CAMP DESCRIPTIONS

Jewelry Making with Marie Hamra: This course is about designing necklaces and bracelets. Students will learn about different materials, beading, braiding, and building techniques to make unique handmade jewelry.

Drawing with Darlene Williams: Students will learn the basics of drawing using graphite, charcoal, and soft pastels. Students will learn a series of skills related to reductive and additive drawing, mark-making techniques, and how to build their own still lives for future exploration.

Drawing and Painting with Briana Earl: An introduction to drawing and painting on paper and canvas. Students will learn with graphite drawing pencils while learning to draw from references to artwork from the museum's permanent collection. Once sketches are completed, students will translate their work to a finished canvas project.

Ceramics with Gail Ritzer: Enjoy an introduction to hand-built ceramics. Students will explore clay by making pinch pots and coil building. Students will have their work fired and be available after camp. Projects from our main museum facility will be available for pick up the following week of class.

Payments and refunds: Payments must be paid in full at registration, and a limited number of payment plans may be available for qualifying families. *All payments must be made before the first day of camp.* Full refunds will be issued 48 hours prior to the first day of camp. Partial refunds may be issued following the first day of camp but are subject to GMoA personnel approval. Scholarships are not available for Spring Break Art Camp. Guidelines: Registration requires consent for the assumption of risk, liability waiver, emergency medical treatment, and photo release forms.

Lunch periods: Full Day Camp/Full Week Camps will have scheduled lunches from 12:00 – 1:00pm. Parents/Guardians are required to provide lunch and beverages for their campers. We encourage lunchboxes and ice packs to help keep lunches stored appropriately.

Additional information: Space is limited, and registration for each age group will close when we have reached capacity. We encourage students to bring a smock, apron, or dress for mess. GMoA is not responsible for damage to clothing. If anyone within your household is sick or showing signs of being sick, please refrain from sending your child to camp. Please get in touch with us to inform us of your child's absence.
